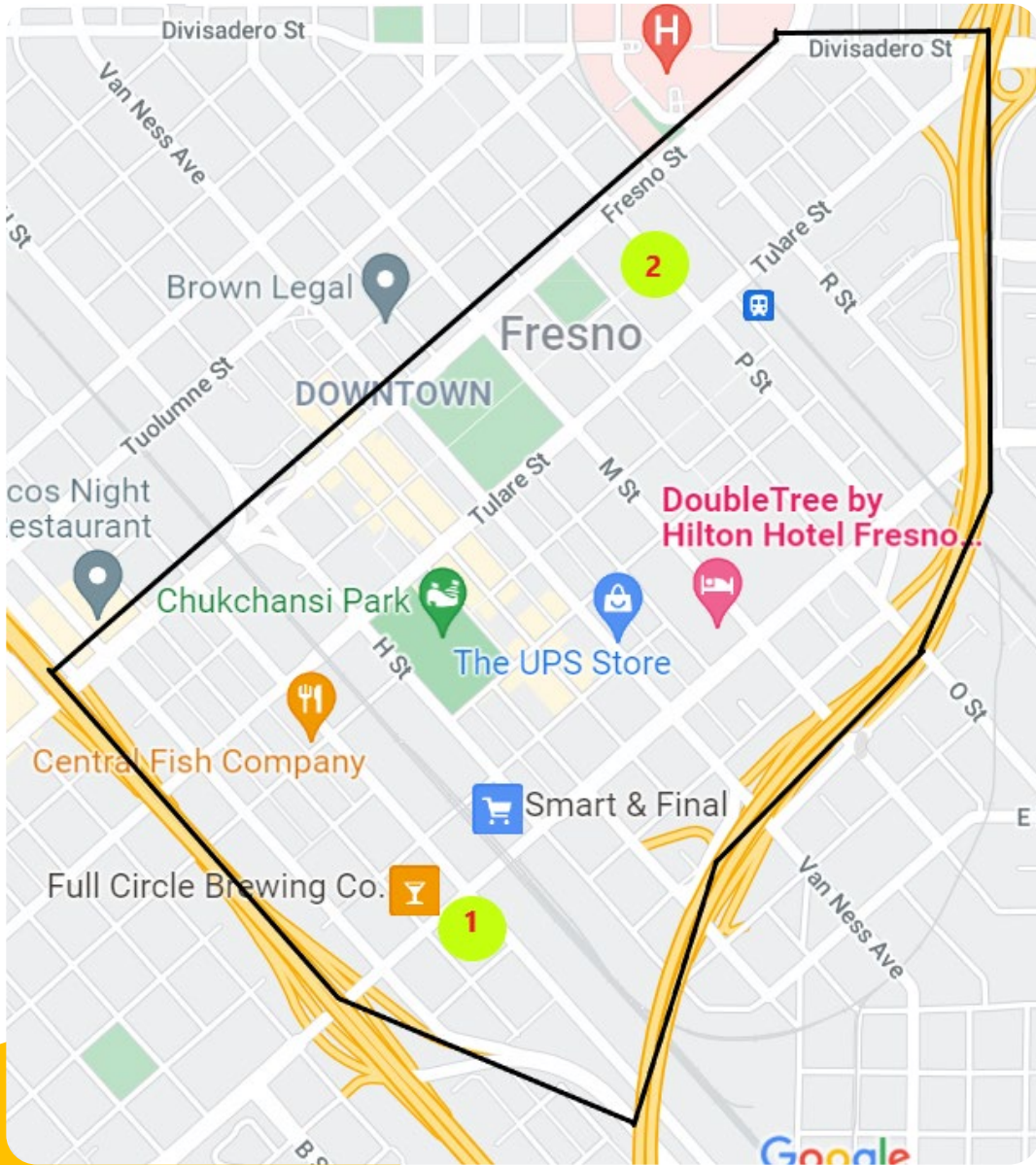
ERF - 2 Project Overview

- \$17 Million was awarded to the City of Fresno to resolve unsheltered homelessness by linking them immediately to emergency shelter and supportive services.
 - Grant Period: June 14, 2023 – June 30, 2026
 - Services are targeted to unsheltered individuals residing in the existing ERF Round 1 encampment site in downtown Fresno.

ERF - 2 Project Overview, Cont.

- Services will include Street Outreach and Navigation, Interim Shelter, Housing Stability Case Management, and Tiny Homes permanent housing development.
- ERF Round 2 Goals:
 - 1,300 individuals will be served over the full grant period based on anticipated inflow to the encampment area.
 - 420 unsheltered individuals will transition to interim shelter.
 - 100 individuals will be connected to permanent housing.
 - Annual surveys to gauge program impact and solicit participant feedback





Downtown Encampment Area

- The ERF-2 Downtown Encampment Area is an 8 by 15-block triangle bounded by Highway 99, Fresno Street and Highway 41.
- The area is a frequent destination for the city's unsheltered population for mainstream services, public transportation, and Coordinated Entry System (CES) access sites.
- Unsheltered individuals in this region experience the highest levels of chronicity and acuity and face greater health risks.

Encampment Area Outreach & Street Navigation

- 6 Street Outreach and Navigation Specialists
- A licensed Street Clinician will provide mental health assessments and services on the street
- Street navigation services will be provided to those unable to access shelter



Clarion Pointe – *Emergency Shelter & Bridge Housing*

- 65 Emergency Shelter Beds
- 25 Bridge Housing Beds
- Low-barrier, housing-focused shelter
- Assessment and Housing Navigation Services
- Housing Stability Case Management
- All Emergency Shelter Beds will transition to Bridge Housing in July 2024
- 30 HHAP-funded Bridge beds are co-located at Clarion Pointe



Village of Hope – *Emergency Shelter*

- 65 Emergency Shelter Beds
- Low-barrier, housing-focused shelter
- Assessment and Housing Navigation Services
- Housing Stability Case Management
- Beginning in July 2024, services currently funded with ERF Round 1 will transition to ERF Round 2





Tiny Homes – *Permanent Housing Development*

- Tiny home village of 26 Permanent Housing Units
- Units will be made available to ERF-2 Bridge Housing residents.
- The City of Fresno will leverage a minimum of \$5 million in additional funds to support project development.
